

Men's Monthly Breakfast

It's November, and guess what we're celebrating this month - the Lord Jesus Christ! That's what we try to do every second Saturday of the month when we gather. If we were the women's group (no offense, ladies), we'd have fall decorations, napkins with turkeys on them, and all the fall colors. When you come to our breakfast at 8 AM on November 9th in the fellowship hall, you'll find tables and chairs, plates and silverware, food and fellowship. The only fall colors you'll see will be on a Virginia Tech Hokies' sweatshirt! We'll continue our 8-week study in Philippians. Did you know that when Paul wishes his readers (including you and me) "peace" he's talking about peace with God, peace with yourself, peace with others, and peace with the creation? That's just like the world God created "in the beginning." Come learn about joy, peace, grace...and cruciformity!



Dad is behind me and says "come on - let's go". I finally get to the top of the ladder and look out. I'm looking at the end of the high dive board at the Colton pool. About 10' above the pool. From my 8 yrs old viewpoint, it looks like what a diff diver sees looking down. Yikes!

"Why am I standing here? Because I want to jump off of the high dive but I'm scared of the unknown - hitting the water if I jump off. What if I go down and can't get back to the surface?

Only one person is allowed on the dive ladder at a time but the lifeguard let's my dad come up on top with me for encouragement. "Come on Jimmy, kids are waiting on you" says dad. Thanks dad for the guilt trip.

I inch my way down the board - is it getting narrower at the end? Yes - just like when you look down a set of railroad tracks that seem to converge at the outer edge.

I keep going - slowly - and now I'm at the end of the board looking down at the water and frozen with fear. If my knees were knocking, it would sound like a pileated woodpecker. "Why did I agree to this?" Is running through my mind. Call me Scaredicatius Maximus.

And then it happened - the push. My dad had come up behind me and given me a gentle push - and over the edge I go - feet first. I grab my nose and pinch it closed as I descend to the water. "Whoosh!" Is what I hear as I go under the surface of the water and bubbles rise up out of my swim trunks. Dad jumps in too a few feet away from me and stays with me as I dog paddle to the edge. I felt a little mad about the push but was glad that dad was with me all the way to the ladder.

And do you know what I did then after exiting the pool? Yep - I got back in line to do it again! And again! And again! Probably jumped off that high dive 50 times that day - and all it took was a little push and some encouragement from my dad.

I think this pattern gets repeated in life whether you're 8 or 80. And there are examples in the Bible where God provides the encouragement and the push to do something. God wanted Moses to lead his people out of Egypt and Moses kept making excuses. I count roughly 5 times he did this! How many times can you tell God no? God gets a little ticked off at Moses.

Exodus 4:10-14

10Then Moses said to the Lord, "O my Lord, I am not eloquent, slow of speech and slow of tongue." 11So the Lord said to him, "Who has made man's mouth? Or who makes the mute, the deaf, the seeing, or the blind? Have not I, the Lord? 12Now therefore, go, and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you shall say." 13But he said, "O my Lord, please send by the hand of whomever else You may send." 14So the anger of the Lord was kindled against Moses, and He said: "Is not Aaron the Levite your brother? I know that he can speak well. And look, he is also coming out to meet you. When he sees you, he will be glad in his heart."

Jonah is another example of getting a push from God because he wanted Jonah to preach to the people of Nineveh (modern day Mosul, Iraq). God said "Go" - Jonah said "No" - God said "Oh?" Then God arranged for Jonah to be swallowed by a big fish - and stay there for 3 days! Talk about a fish story!

Jonah 3:1-3

1 Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah the second time, saying, 2"Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and preach to it the message that I tell you." 3 So Jonah arose and went to Nineveh, according to the word of the Lord. But Jonah arose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the Lord. He went down to Joppa, and found a ship going to Tarshish; so he paid the fare, and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish from the presence of the Lord.

Jonah finally stopped carping (yes - I went there) to God and got to work according to the story. And he preached to and saved Ninevah.


About 7 years ago I got the overwhelming feeling that I should visit Rwanda and the ZOE kids. I resisted and tried to forget the feeling. But I couldn't - it got worse. I didn't sleep well for 2 nights and the pressure kept increasing. I believe the Holy Spirit was working on me giving me a push. So, on the 3rd day of this, I relented and said out loud "ok!, I'll go". Immediately this pressure feeling (I don't know how else to describe it) lifted - and I got some sleep. I learned that God doesn't like to take no as a answer. That trip to Rwanda changed me - for the better.

Therefore, ask yourself: "Is God tapping me on the shoulder and asking me to do some job within the church? Is there a ministry opportunity that the Holy Spirit wants me to try? Do you need a little push there buttercup?

Don't ignore those feelings. They're real. Pray about it. Jump off the board. Let's cowboy up and get to work.



From Transitional to Global Methodist Church North Carolina

North Carolina Provisional Annual Conference

With the completion of the Convening General Conference of the Global Methodist Church, many transitional labels **Convening General Conference** of the Global Methodist Church North Carolina. The Convening General Conference solidified much of the governance and leadership for the new denomination to move forward in the Holy Spirit. Six new bishops were elected to join the two already in place, but instead of administering the church as an institution, they will be shepherding churches. Instead of being assigned to an annual conference, the eight bishops, who are interim until full elections take place at the 2026 General Conference, will focus on teaching, preaching and spiritual leadership. Instead of being elected for life, they will serve (at the most) two six-year terms. The new bishops joining the two current bishops, Scott Jones of East Texas and Mark Webb of Upstate New York, are Kimba Evariste from the Democratic Republic of Congo, Carolyn Moore from North Georgia, Leah Hidde-Gregory from Mid-Texas, John Pena Auta of Nigeria, Jeff Greenway from the Ohio/Pennsylvania area, and

Kenneth Livingston, from Houston, Texas - two African men, two American women, one Black American man, and three white American men. Conference superintendents will be responsible for administering annual conferences.
